What is the GRE?



- **Graduate Record Examination**
- **Tests your knowledge and test-taking abilities**
- **Shows PT schools you can pass a standardized exam**
- **ETS.org**

6 sections total:

- **Verbal Reasoning - 2 sections**
- **Quantitative Reasoning - 2 sections**
- **Analytical Writing - 1 section, 2 tasks**
- **Unscored/Research - 1 section, does not count towards your score**

Measure	Number of Questions	Allotted Time
Analytical Writing (One section with two separately timed tasks)	One "Analyze an Issue" task and one "Analyze an Argument" task	30 minutes per task
Verbal Reasoning (Two sections)	20 questions per section	30 minutes per section
Quantitative Reasoning (Two sections)	20 questions per section	35 minutes per section
Unscored¹	Varies	Varies
Research²	Varies	Varies

How to Study for the GRE



- **Take practice tests**
 - You receive 2 free practice tests when you sign up for your exam
- **Create a plan**
 - Give yourself enough time to study
 - Stick to your plan
 - Self discipline is **KEY**

- **Review vocab & study root words**
 - **Free Magoosh vocab flashcard app**
- **You can take the GRE every 21 days**
 - **Up to 5x in a calendar year**
- **Cost - \$206 per exam**
 - **You can apply for a waiver if you are eligible**
- **You can send your scores to up to 4 schools the day of your exam for FREE**
 - **Make sure you know the name of school(s) and their GRE code(s)**
